## CITY COUNCIL MEETING 04-15-2024

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Rick Coleman, Larry Bishop, and City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, City Clerk Nicholas New, Police Chief Richard Bickerstaff, Court Clerk Jodie McKinney, and Breanna Minter from the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor Roy Adamson called the meeting to order. Mayor then asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous Council meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was made by Council Member Bishop and seconded by Council Member Appleby to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

First on the agenda was to amend the City's capital outlay budget to include a purchase of a 2024 Chevrolet Tahoe for \$49,000.00. A motion was made by Councilmember Bishop and seconded by Councilmember Proctor to approve this amendment and purchase. The vote was unanimous.

Next on the agenda was to approve a contract with Cook's Pest Control for termite treatment at the library. The total cost is \$1,519.00 with a \$500.00/year annual fee. A motion was made by Councilmember Smith and seconded by Councilmember Coleman to approve this contract. The vote was unanimous.

City Clerk New read into the minutes a congressional record presented to the City of Lineville for their 125<sup>th</sup> year celebration.

Lastly on the agenda was to surplus 10 computers and one copy machine. These items have no monetary value and will be disposed. A motion was made by Councilmember Appleby and seconded by Councilmember Coleman to surplus these items. The vote was unanimous.

City Clerk New mentioned that the library secured funding of \$2,800.00 to help pay for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library. Councilmember Smith also mentioned that the library is working on a grant to place reading stations in the City park.

Councilmember Proctor mentioned that the annual park board golf tournament was a success and that they are now working on Oldie's Under the Stars which will be June 14<sup>th</sup>.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Bishop and seconded by Council Member Coleman. The vote was unanimous. The Meeting ended at 5:11 p.m.
